Reclassification for grades 6-12 will be determined prior to October 31 (End date for CELDT testing).
(Reclassification and placement in SDAIE English is no longer allowed mid year.)

- ★ High school students who have met all other criteria, but score at the low Basic level may be brought before the ELD Reclassification Committee for consideration; the committee is comprised of the classroom teacher, ELD department chair, ELD curriculum specialist and an assistant principal.
- ★ Parents have the right to withdraw their student from the ELD program; AUSD will meet with the parents to review options and recommendations. Students who are withdrawn from the program must still take the annual CELDT test until they meet the required criteria for reclassification.
